

Waterfall and Ecosystem Pond Pittsburgh, PA

This project was completed for Robert and Geraldine Pletcher in 2001 and it's the most impressive job Pittsburgh Stone and Waterscapes has done to date. The trust and financial flexibility of this client gave us the opportunity to build our first large-scale, fully functional ecosystem.

Over a period of nineteen months, we were able to build the water feature to the correct size and depth to assure a healthy environment for hundreds of fish, plants, and other aquatic life.

This project was constructed over a 19-month period. It includes nine retaining walls (equaling 2500 square feet of architectural pavers), a water feature containing three ponds, three streams, five waterfalls, and approximately 20,000 gallons of water. All of this required the excavation of thousands of tons of soil.

Due to precision planning and the hard work of an experienced crew we were able to construct what we consider to be our most beautiful and fully functional water feature to date.
